



Result for Milton over bus cuts Stagecoach trump Council over subsidised services

After a public meeting on 17th March 2001, attended by an estimated 130 Milton residents, some proposed cancellations to bus services have been reconsidered.

The Council had withdrawn the subsidy for evening services to Milton on the Number 9 bus, and Stagecoach had decided to terminate the Citi 2 service to Milton at the Science Park. There were fears that one of the many consequences of this would be that people walking home from the Science Park would be put in harm's way.

Andy Campbell, Managing Director of Stagecoach East, attended the meeting, and wrote to Richard Summerfield, chairman of Milton Parish Council, the next day to say "following last night's meeting we have looked at the option of operating the 23.03 Citi 2 from the City centre to Milton. We have asked for a letter of support from the county council so we can register it" (see Chairman's update page 4).

There is a feeling among local residents that this concession would not have come about had they not been able to make their feelings known.

Pressed by members of the audience about the effect of the cuts on the many disabled and elderly people in Milton, and the students at the Agricultural college, Glenn Edge, Head of Passenger Transport Services, Cambridgeshire County Council, responded that other areas had 'more essential social needs' but admitted that his timetable for cuts had not allowed him to "negotiate alternatives or compromises". As


stated in the official Minutes (see mvv.org.uk/organisations), Mr Campbell commented that "the Council subsidised certain services (like the No 9's Sunday and evening services) because it had deemed them socially necessary. By cutting these services, the Council appears to be reversing that decision and claiming that these services are no longer socially necessary".

Local residents had been vociferous in their opposition to the changes.

Heather Coleman, who lives in Pearson Court in the North East of the village, is aware how far it is for the elderly or those with less mobility to walk from the Science Park or to the Park & Ride site. Writing on *Milton Chat*, Dr Coleman said "since the Park & Ride stops at 9pm, this is no use for anyone wishing to go to the theatre or a concert or out to eat. It is also no use for a person under the age of 17 who wishes to meet their friends in town to go to the pictures of an evening".

Local resident Paul Oldham, who runs *Milton Chat*, commented "it's the County who are cutting the funding leaving Stagecoach with a serious loss of income and less services to run [sic]".

On the proposal to terminate the Citi 2 at the Science Park, local resident Barry Moore was quoted in the *Cambridge News* as saying "walking to the Science Park can take a good 15 or 20 minutes from Milton village, where there are [currently] about five stops in total." **Continued on page 2**



Concern over A10 bridge

With the new cycle path shortly to be opened, the Citi 2 bus service cancelled, and the school bus also threatened, local residents have expressed concern about the safety of the bridge over the A10.

Some have commented that if students are compelled to use this bridge, should the school bus service end, they may be tempted to ignore the sign and ride over it, increasing the danger of somebody falling over the side.

Michael Williamson, County Councillor responsible for roads and buses, commented on the MVV website "I am very aware of the concerns that the new path might cause free bus travel to be withdrawn for Milton students attending IVC".



The new cycle path might, ironically, save the school bus service.

Clr Williamson's information was that "at this width [1.5m] and in accordance with the current policy guidance, school bus travel would not be withdrawn".

Clr Williamson later confirmed to MVV that "I have been told by a Council officer that the nature of the cycleway actually being constructed should mean that it will not be of a sufficient standard for it to be regarded as providing a safe route. If that is the case, then in many ways we get the best of both worlds - a safer route for those cycling between Milton and Impington and the retention of free school transport."

Background to the bus cuts

Milton Village View had previously been informed by Glenn Edge on 22 Feb 2011 that the Council had "voted to phase out funding for subsidised bus services". Mr Edge supplied details of the discontinuation by Stagecoach of the No. 9 evening service through Milton due to the lack of Council

financial support.

This coincided with the cancellation by Stagecoach of the Citi 2 to Milton, and MVV asked Mr Edge whether Milton residents would be satisfied with the explanation that the bus cuts were chiefly down to Stagecoach rather than the result of the Council's actions. Mr Edge told MVV "at no time have I hid behind the 'it's nothing to

do with us' line" and continued "Stagecoach may be taking some commercial decisions based on reduced local authority funding".

Councillor Hazel Smith's petition against the cuts had gained nearly 300 signatures.

In the Chairman's update (see page 4) Richard Summerfield says "Despite this bit of good news, the cuts in village bus services will still affect a wide range of Milton residents – students, working professionals, the elderly and infirm".

From the Desk of the Parish Council Chairman

April 2011

The proposed changes to both the Citi2 and No 9 bus services are of major concern for the village. At the public meeting on Thursday 17th March hosted by the parish council, representatives from Stagecoach and Cambridgeshire County Council were on hand to explain the rationale behind these cuts and listen to villagers' concerns. I feel it was a productive meeting and was glad to see such a large number of residents in attendance. One proposal, suggested by villager Anna Bradnam, was for Stagecoach to run at least one late night bus service. I'm happy to report that Andy Campbell, the Managing Director of Stagecoach East, has agreed to this proposal and will operate a 23.03 Citi2 bus from the City centre to Milton.

Despite this bit of good news, the cuts in village bus services will still affect a wide range of Milton residents – students, working professionals, the elderly and infirm. At the public meeting, we heard from parents, young people and older residents as well as individuals from Edmund House, all of whom rely on these bus services. The cuts are particularly galling as the government is repeatedly calling for people to move to public transport. How can we do this when our bus service is being withdrawn!

In other issues, a few residents have recently brought up safety concerns in the village: cars parking near the junction of The Rowans and Cambridge Road; cars parking by the One Stop shop obscuring vision at the zebra crossing; and the zebra crossing at Tesco. I would like to remind everyone to take extra care when crossing at these points and to keep safety in mind at all times. The Clerk has spoken with the community beat officer PC Shulver, who emphasized that pedestrian crossings should be used as a give-way, i.e. stop, look and make sure all vehicles have stopped before you cross.

There have also been numerous complaints from both cyclists and motorists about the floodlights illuminating a new sign at the

Milton Golf Course. The District Council's Planning Enforcement Team is taking this matter up with the owner.

On a more positive note, the opening ceremony for the newly refurbished Community Centre was held on the 10th of February. Congratulations to all those involved for a job well done! We have also set up a page on the Local Giving website to generate donations for our Mobile Warden Scheme in the village: www.localgiving.com/MiltonCommunityCareScheme Finally, just a reminder, if anyone has had any thoughts or ideas about Christmas lights for next year, please let the Clerk know.

Report from PCSO Mason

PCSO John Mason works from Histon Police Station and deals with police related community issues and concerns.

We summarise his most recent report here:

Myself and PC Phil Shulver have been dealing with many issues in the neighbourhood ranging from neighbourhood disputes and anti-social behaviour to sudden deaths and burglaries. Recently we have had an increase in the number of cycles stolen in the area. Please ensure that you secure your cycles and if possible do not store them in the open, particularly at the front of your property. I understand that this is not always possible but even cycles that are secured have been removed by determined thieves so please try not to leave cycles on display.

We often receive useful calls advising us of suspicious activity and vehicles etc. Although normally it turns out that everything is in order, it is not always the case. A recent call from a Neighbourhood Watch coordinator was responded to by officers who discovered a parked vehicle at the location being used by the occupants to take drugs. A search was carried out but no drugs were found. However all details were taken and local officers are now aware of this vehicle and can keep an eye out should it return to the area.

Bridge over A10

Dear Editor

Regarding the inadequate condition of the bridge over the A10: one would have thought that such a low fenced bridge clearly stands out as being a health and safety deficit, not meeting current conditions (cf. the Jane Coston bridge) and would therefore be a contravention of modern requirements (what probably 'excuses' this, is the fact that the bridge was constructed over 30 years ago). But I do not think we should accept this! By the way, as both a cyclist and a walker to the Park & Ride, it is obvious, apart from the narrowness of the bridge and steep slopes at each end, and the low fence, that the bridge is not suitable for cycling over. Also pedestrians have the added danger of being hit by a cyclist. That is why there are notices advising cyclists to dismount - but many young cyclists do not. I abide by this advice because I am well retired and not tempted to take on the steep slopes on the bridge! Another aspect about the cycle path between Milton and Impington, is my recommendation of reducing the nominal speed limit along the adjacent road from 60 mph to 40 mph - this should be done on most roads connecting the 'necklace' of villages around the city of Cambridge, particularly where footpath/cyclepaths are concerned. But do the authorities get the sense of this - I have seen little action yet?

I sincerely hope my comments will be of use to you in your task of being a great service to the community of Milton as the new editory of the MVV.

Thank you for your most constructive remarks recently concerning the magazine. I would be delighted to make some clarifications, as you request, and publish them for the benefit of others also:

We are adhering to the tradition in the magazine of reproducing the Chairman's article verbatim. We do not proof it or make corrections. Therefore if readers take issue with anything in the Chairman's article, this should be addressed to his office.

Regarding the A10 bridge, I agree that there is an issue here. This was built some time ago, and is dangerous to cycle over, as it is comparatively narrow and the side railings are low. In my view, cycling in general should be encouraged (for all sorts of very good reasons), but if students are compelled to use the bridge in the event of the school bus being cancelled, and are tempted to ride over it, then the danger of somebody falling over the side and going under a car on the bypass beneath increases dramatically. In any event, there seems to be a strong case for making representations about the need for this bridge to be upgraded, or a Pelican crossing to be put in - although these can generate their own problems (if anyone has more information or an opinion on this we would very much like to hear it).

On the issue you raise about publishing the names of the team: I would mention firstly that all articles should show a byline under the headline in the traditional way, so that readers know the contributors' names. Regarding the rest of the team, all our volunteers have been happy to remain anonymous, and the new Editorial Board decided there was no need for their own names to take up valuable space in the magazine. However, this seems like an excellent opportunity for me to thank the Mary Ann Johnson, Rob Howe, and also all our delivery people, for their continued support.
